There are also a variety of college major or career specific scholarships available on my website. Students need to stop and visit with me about these to pick up the application.

Junior "To Do List"

Juniors and Junior Parents,

It is difficult to believe that it is time to start planning for college, but it is! The more prepared you are for your senior year, the more you will all enjoy it. Your senior year will go fast and there will be many important deadlines for you to be prepared for so that you are best prepared for college. I have provided you a variety of activities to start considering and planning for over the next few months.

ACT:

It is time to take the ACT test. The test will be offered in April and June. It is important to take it once or twice before your final test opportunities in the fall of your senior year. Dates are posted on the ACT site, and Overton Public School is a testing site. You must take the test by December to be considered for academic scholarships. Have your scores sent directly to the college(s) you are considering attending. College codes can be found on the ACT website, on my website, or I can help you find them. Register at <http://www.actstudent.org>

College Visits:

Colleges offer many group tours throughout the spring and summer. Check out the website and admissions page of the college you are interested in to find out about tours they are offering. Some colleges even offer \$500 or \$1,000 off of your tuition if you attend a college tour day!

Get Familiar With My Website:

I have provided detailed and specific information on my website for college planning and scholarships. Please take time to look at the information provided as you plan and prepare for next year.

Financial Aid & Scholarships:

The financial aid process is changing. You will actually be able to apply for financial aid in the fall (of your senior year), using your current income tax information. Having the financial information earlier may help you decide which college is the best fit for you. This also means you have one more thing to do in the fall of your senior year. Many of the major scholarships and individual college academic scholarships are due by November 15th. I provide a general list of scholarships, not a complete list or individualized list. You can begin to look at scholarships that best fit your experiences and interests so you know what scholarships to focus on and apply for.

Job Shadows and Career Exploration:

Over the summer, after school, or on the weekends, consider volunteering or asking for a Job Shadow Experience at a business or company that you are considering a career in or are interested in learning more about. Also ask to have time to visit with someone about careers and the job skills and education needed to become successfully employed with their company or in that career field.

Senior Pictures:

The summer between your junior and senior year is a great time to get your senior pictures taken. You will need to be able to turn your picture in to me by December 1st. It does indeed seem like a long time away, but plan ahead, photographers are busy people too.
