Greetings from the Business Department:

The 2016-17 year has gotten off to a very fast beginning. Here is what the Business Classes as well as FBLA and Yearbook is also doing for the year ahead.

Accounting 1- Students are in the process of learning the Accounting cycle for a business. The students are progressing very well and are great students to have in class. They seem to be picking up on the material real fast and are very good at learning business procedures.

Informational Technology-These students are my Freshman and they are still in the process of learning how to use the keyboard. I feel it is very imperative that students understand the process of typing before they to-tally break into the production of the computer processing. The students will be finishing up typing at the end of the semester and next semester will hit all the facets of Microsoft Office. We have a very big class and they are working extremely well the challenge of having a big class.

Business Management/Entrepreneurship- These students are in the process of learning how to be leaders in society and in business and understand what it takes to manage a business. The students are learning many styles of leadership right now and they are learning to capture a vision and teach their workers how to have a mission in a business. Next Semester they will be learning how to run a business and make a business plan of their liking, I am very interested to see what students will vision and plan for their business.

Computers 7/8-These students are in the beginning of learning to use the keyboard and understand why typing is so very important. We are teaching them the keyboard and challenge them every week to gain speed and accuracy while they type.

Business Math/Personal Finance- These students are in the process of learning the basics of Business Math or what I call "life math." These students are learning how to figure out their hourly wages, overtime, etc. The students are also learning how to figure out taxes that come out of their paychecks and also learning how to do their taxes. Next semester the students will be learning how to budget their own money, and find colleges that are suitable for them, along with learn how to plan for their future as adults. I look very forward to their progress.

Marketing/Business Communications- These students are getting to learn what it is like to market themselves to the world around them. The students are learning what it takes to market a business, market products and services and then sell themselves to make them marketable for a career. Next semester they will learn how to do resumes, letters of applications, interviews which will help them gain the necessary information to be able to land a job in the real world.

Yearbook- The students have taken on a huge second step into the journey of learning how to meet the vision and mission of what Mr. Gilson and last years inaugural class has structured so that we can maintain a quality driven, low cost, student lead yearbook for our community of Overton. The year before I came hear the yearbook was selling at 35 dollars a yearbook and was in a budget deficet for a yearbook class. With the help of Mr. Aten using a different yearbook company, Mr. Fleischman allowing me to change the style of the yearbook class by running it like a business, and myself budgeting to make sure that we balance our budget, our inagural yearbook class last year lowered the yearbook to 33 dollars and also fundraised and sold more advertisements and set a benchmark to run a successful business. This year the Yearbook class has been challenged to take another huge progressive step in the success of our Yearbook Business by lowering the cost of the Yearbook to 32 dollars and still pursuing to balance the budget while lowering the cost of the yearbook. This will be a huge challenge for this class because with prices going up every year and our class trying to find a lower cost to the yearbook this is a monumental challenge for our class. We plan on doing some fundraisers and selling concessions during basketball games this year so please plan on attending and purchasing at our concession stands. Also we will begin selling yearbooks this year starting in December before Christmas, so if you are interested in purchasing a yearbook for your student as a christmas present just let us know or bring in a check or cash to Mr. Gilson in the Business Department. The cost of the yearbook this year will be 29 dollars without a name on the yearbook cover or 32 dollars with a name on the yearbook cover.

FBLA- This year has been a great start to the 2nd year of Mr. Gilson's sponsoring the FBLA. Last year we had a very good year of our 10 students that signed up for FBLA. The students did a great job of setting a structure for the group that pillared attendance, service, hard work, dedication. This year we had a !00% increase in membership with having 20 members join rather than 10 members from last year which I was very happy to see. We started off the year having a benefit cake raffle for Breast Cancer Awareness and donated the proceeds to Susan G. Komen Foundation. It was a great evening of volleyball to raise awareness of Breast Cancer. The students will also be doing a March of Dimes Project to look forward to and many concession fundraisers to help fund their way to Omaha for the State Conference. -Apply to colleges before Christmas Break so that you can figure out what schools you want to attend.

SENIOR PICTURES

-Just another reminder that senior pictures are due on December 1st!

-A total of 3 pictures need to be given to to Mrs. McCoy. These are for the yearbook, composite in the commons area, and for publication (the Beacon, Clipper and the graduation slide show, these "publication pictures" will all be the same picture).

-Please label your pictures with your name (printed first & last), and which picture you would like to appear where. The closer up, head & shoulders shots are best for the papers. Pictures for the yearbook and the composite (entryway photo gallery) need to be vertical.
