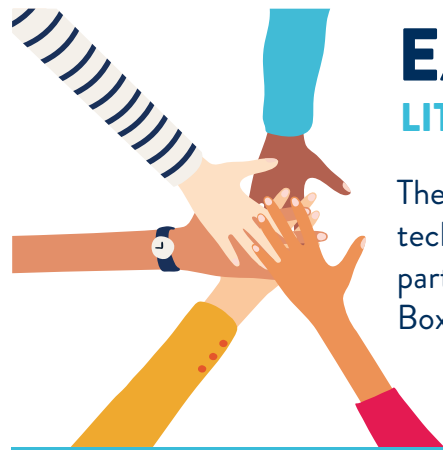

Elementary Spanish with Señora Luther

¡Hola! ¡Buenos días! ¡Buenas tardes! ¿Cómo estás? These are a few of the greetings that you will hear being used in elementary classrooms at Overton Public Schools. This year, elementary students in grades Kindergarten through 4 will be introduced to basic Spanish. Kindergarteners, 1st and 2nd graders engage in their calendar routine 2 days each week completely in Spanish. Mimicking the calendar routine that students do in English, these young learners are acquiring the Spanish language for days of the week, months of the year, seasons, clothing, numbers, weather, colors, and basic greetings. Song and movement are incorporated to help to increase memory of these new words. The students are enjoying the Spanish calendar time and can often be heard singing the days of the week and common greetings in Spanish!

Students in 3rd and 4th grade will have the opportunity to benefit from this new offering at our school as well. Currently, 4th grades are immersed into the Spanish language for a 30 minute lesson 2 times each week. The lessons include basic phrases that students would need to communicate using everyday vocabulary. These lessons have a verbal focus, with the goal of students being able to ask and answer questions in Spanish. Topics will include school items, school subjects, sports and hobbies, food, animals and family. Students will also be able to respond to basic commands. Beginning 2nd semester, 3rd graders will have their turn to soak up the Spanish language as well.

Each student was able to make their own mask to take home and wear to school. The students did a great job using the sewing machine and now have some really cool homemade masks. The 8th grade class also made homemade lanyards to hold their masks when they are eating, their ID badges or keys.

Mrs. Ehlers' Introduction to Design class recently learned about color and the color wheel. They were able to demonstrate their knowledge by taking red, blue and yellow food coloring and making frosting in the correct hues to create their own edible color wheels.

National Farm to School Month


