Reminders:

- With the seasons changing, I would like to remind parents to help us by ensuring your child is prepared properly for the elements. 
2nd Grade Math/STEM Activities



Chapter members were also able to hear from keynote speaker Mike Donahue about how everyone has a story an we all need to put our selves in other people's shoes.



Manipulatives in Math


6th graders are learning about surface area by using connecting cubes. Working with a group and using manipulatives can help make connections and generate discussions.

Students use iPads to practice individual skills to reinforce concepts taught in the classroom. Zearn and IXL are digital tools to help students learn new concepts.





Revised Math Standards for Mathematics

The Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) establishes content area standards for all Nebraska Schools to meet. On September 2, 2022, the Nebraska State Board of Education approved Nebraska's College and Career Ready Standards for Mathematics. Although Overton has already been meeting the state math standards previously in effect, we will be undergoing a process to meet the new/revised standards that have just been approved in September. This process will include a thorough review of the newly adopted standards themselves, a curriculum selection process, and curriculum alignment of the standards to make sure we are meeting and exceeding the new standards at every level of an Overton student's education.

As we work through our process, we will utilize the knowledge and help of our educational service unit (ESU 10), our staff, and professionals in other school districts as well. Having been through many content area revisions in the past, the staff understands that it will require a lot of time and effort to adjust our curriculum to meet the state standards. The end result will be to best meet the needs of our students, best utilize the talents of the staff, and provide the highest quality of mathematics education possible at Overton.

We view the newly approved standards as an opportunity to improve, although we do expect a little stress along the way to the goal of improvement. Please know that we will approach this change as an opportunity to learn professionally, better understand all levels of math education at Overton, and work together as a team all while keeping the best interests of our students at the forefront of our decisions.

Harvest of the Month NEBRASKA

CARROTS

Carrots are shining in the spotlight as our Nebraska Harvest of the Month item. This versatile veggie can be eaten raw, roasted, baked into cakes, or added to smoothies.

SELECTION, STORAGE & COOKING


- If carrots come to you with greens attached, remove the greens before storing. Carrot greens are edible and delicious - they can be used to make pesto or as an addition to soup stock.
- For long term storage, keep carrots in a plastic bag, stored in the refrigerator.
- Carrot skin is very thin and doesn't need to be peeled - just wash well to remove any dirt or debris.
- While cooking marinara sauce, add diced carrots for a hint of sweetness!

NUTRITIONAL TIP

Carrots contain high quantities of beta-carotene, vitamin K, biotin and Vitamin B6. The human body converts beta-carotene, the orange/red pigment of a plant, into Vitamin A which is important to immune, skin, and eye health.

HONEY GARLIC BUTTER ROASTED CARROTS

Ingredients:

- 2 lbs carrots cut into thirds
- 1/3 cup butter
- 3 TBL honey
- 4 garlic cloves minced
- 1/4 1/2 tsp. salt plus more for seasoning
- Cracked black pepper

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 425°F. Lightly grease a large baking sheet with nonstick cooking oil spray; set aside.
- 2. Melt butter and honey in pan. Add garlic and cook for 30 seconds.
- 3. Add carrots and allow the sauce to thicken for 1 minute. Season to taste.
- 4. Transfer carrots to a baking sheet in a single layer. Toss to evenly coat.
- 5. Roast for 20 minutes, or until carrots are fork-tender. Broil on high for 2-3 minutes to crisp.








- 6. Try your hand at drawing illustrations to go along with your wacky carrot tale!




