Reminders:

- With the seasons changing, I would like to remind parents to help us by ensuring your child is prepared properly for the elements. Brian Fleischman — Distinguished Service Award





Acostúmbrate a hacer preguntas – leyendo no es pasivo.

Leyendo en voz alta no solo se trata de la historia – también se trata se trata de mantener interesado el cerebro de sus hijos. ¡Siempre haga preguntas!

Hay tres tipos de preguntas básicas que ayudaran a expandir y a desarrollar esas mentes jóvenes:

Preguntas Literales — Estas se encuentra justo en frente de ti para ayudar a enseñar el vocabulario e la información.

¿Qué color es ese? ¿Qué tipo de planta es esta?

Preguntas Inferenciales — Tu niño tendrá que entender la información en el libro para poder encontrar la respuesta. Este tipo de pregunta ayuda a los niños mirar más allá de las palabras y hacia las ideas.

¿A ese animal le gusta lo que está comiendo? ¿Cómo se sintió el personaje?

Preguntas Evaluativas — Lo que los niños piensan de las situaciones en el libro. Estas preguntas son un juicio personal y ayudan a tu pequeño tomar una posición sobre la historia. Les ayuda a desarrollar su empatía y perspectiva; mejora sus habilidades comunicativas; y les ayuda a contar sus propias historias.

¿Piensas que el personaje es amable? ¿Piensas que eso era algo bueno? ¿Qué hicieras tú?

Para nuestros lectores más pequeños, será difícil lograr que entiendan todas las preguntas.
Pero a medida que crecen, sus cerebros necesitan ser alimentados – asegúrate de cambiar las preguntas cuando les leas en voz alta para asegurarte que capten todo.

Get in the habit of asking questions - reading isn't passive.

When reading aloud, it is not just about the story – it's also about engaging your children's brains. **Always ask questions!**

There are three basic types of questions to help young minds expand and develop:

Literal Questions — These are right in front of you to help teach vocabulary and information.

What color is that? What type of plant is this?

Inferential Questions — Your child will have to follow the information in the book to get the answer. These help children look beyond just the words and to the ideas.

Does that animal like what it is eating? How did the character feel?

Evaluative Questions — What children think about a book's situation. These are judgment calls and will help your little one take a position on the story. They will benefit your child's development of empathy and perspective; improve their communication skills; and teach them to tell their own stories.

Did you think that the character was nice? Do you think that was a good thing? What would you do?

For our earliest readers, it will be hard to get them to understand all the questions. But as they grow, their brains need to be fed – make sure you mix up the questions that you ask when reading aloud so they get it all. Read Aloud
