Kindergarten Enrollment Requirements: Students must be 5 years of age by July 31 to be allowed to attend Kindergarten. If your child turns 5 between August 1st and October 15th, you may request your child be assessed on their readiness for Kindergarten work. There is paperwork that must be completed prior to this assessment. You will need to contact the school to receive and complete the Written Request for Consideration of Early Kindergarten Entrance. The testing will take place this summer on a date to be determined. All students will need a Kindergarten physical before beginning school in the fall. If your child was enrolled in our Pre-Kindergarten (4-year preschool) during the 24-25 school year, they do not need to complete further enrollment paperwork to attend Kindergarten. You will just need to bring their completed Kindergarten physical to the school. Students who were not enrolled in our Pre-Kindergarten class during the 24-25 school year will need to visit the school, after the school year has completed, to complete the enrollment paperwork prior to enrollment in the fall.


Overton competed in traditional which includes a cheer combined with a dance. A requirement of traditional routines is tumbling and stunting.

Overton competed in Game Day which is set up to mirror a game day performance like at a football game. This consists of a band chant, cheer, a situational side line, and school fight song.


GROWTH

Last year Overton earned top 5 in Game Day. This year without deductions they would have also earned a top 5 finish. This helps us grow and learn for next year.













TRADITIONAL STATE RUNNER-UP




Overton also earned an academic excellence award for a 3.30 team cumulative GPA.

Exploring Our Nebraska History

On February 19, the Freshmen class visited the Nebraska Prairie Museum in Holdrege. The visit concluded our Holocaust unit. Students read the novel *Night* by Elie Wiesel and, through his story, learned about life in Jewish ghettos and Nazi concentration camps. Our visit to the museum was a chance to learn about one of Nebraska's most important services during the war: Prisoner of War (POW) camps.

Overton alum Samuel Banzhaf, now curator of the museum, spoke to the Freshmen about the POW camp near Atlanta. Through a presentation and his explanations of the POW exhibit, students learned about the role played by POWs during their stay, their living conditions, and the lasting connections made between the prisoners and Nebraska farm families. Following the talk by Mr. Banzhaf, students had time to explore the rest of the museum. They enjoyed exhibits highlighting the progression in Nebraska from past to present.

Students are currently working on taking their knowledge from the book and their discoveries from the museum visit to write an essay comparing and contrasting life in the Nazi concentration work camps to life in the POW camps. In addition to being an excellent way to practice writing, learning to compare/contrast is a valuable skill that will benefit them the rest of their lives.
